"In whom we have redemption through his blood, even the forgiveness of sins."

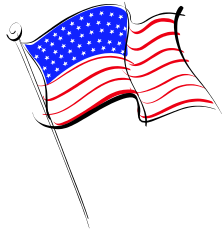


New International Version

O God Our Help in Ages Past

Christianity was facing a dark future in England when Queen Anne forced through Parliament the Schism Act designed to severely limit religious freedom.

Against this black backdrop, Isaac Watts wrote the stately, **reassuring hymn "O God Our Help in Ages Past."** How the words must have brought renewed courage and comfort to Christians in those days of fear and instability.

Onward Christian Soldiers

This hymn was written by a pastor. At that time, the custom in town was for the children to march from one town to another with banners. The pastor wanted the children to sing a hymn as they go. Since nothing was suitable, he wrote one himself - late the night before the march!

He wrote more that 60 books in the British Museum, but was **most remembered as the author of "Onward Christian Soldiers."**

A great many mistakes are made about the promises of God. Some think that if God is to be with them they will have nothing to do. Joshua did not find it so. He and his troops had to slay every Amorite, and Hittite, and Hivite that fell in battle. He had to fight, and use his sword-arm just as much as if there had been no God at all. The best and wisest thing in the world is to work as if it all depended upon you, and then trust in God, knowing that it all depends on Him.
